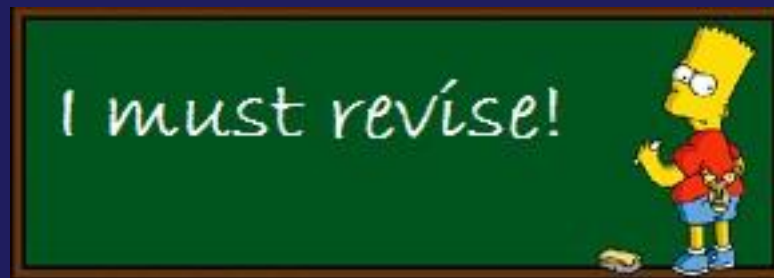
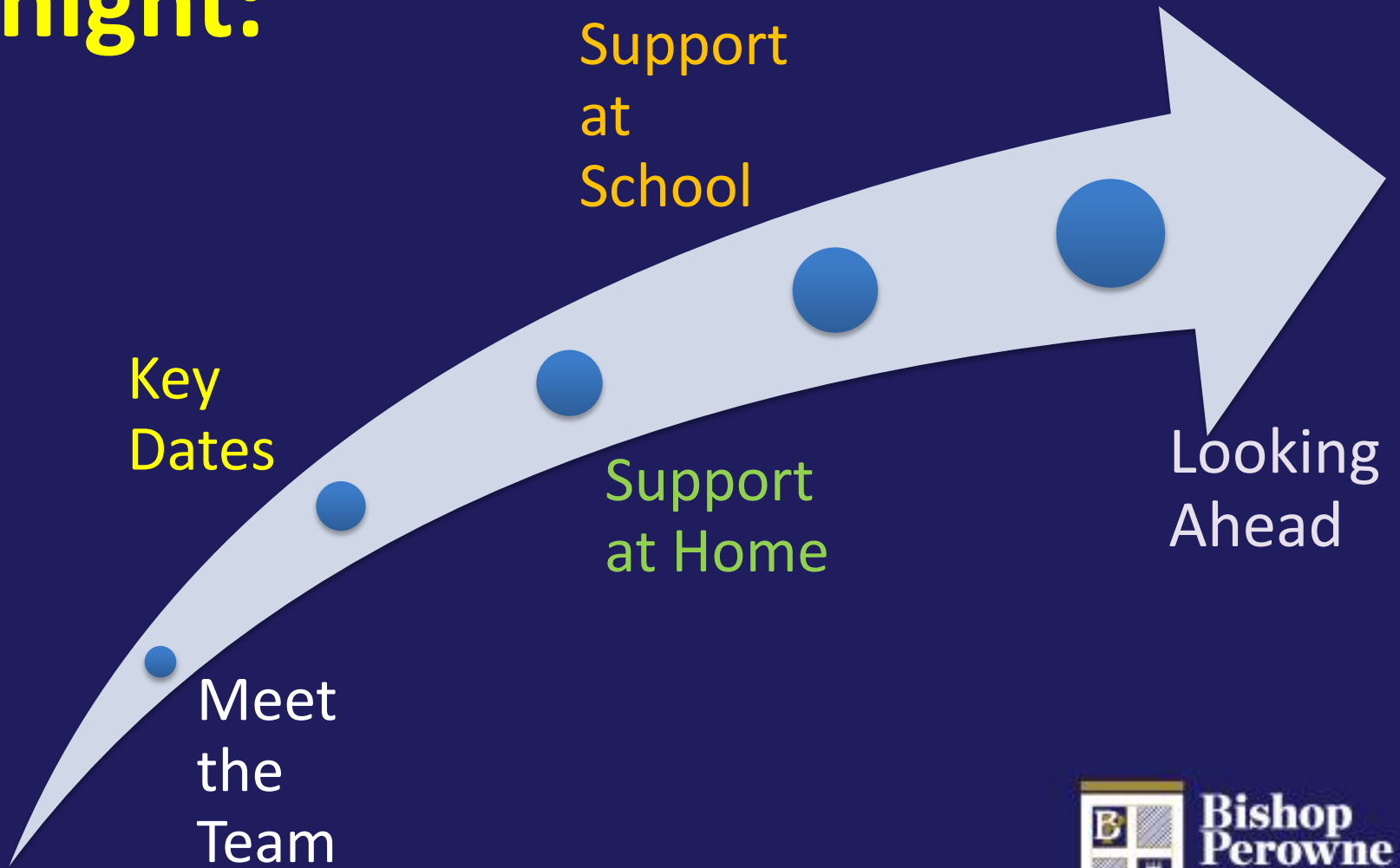

- Exercise or play sport.



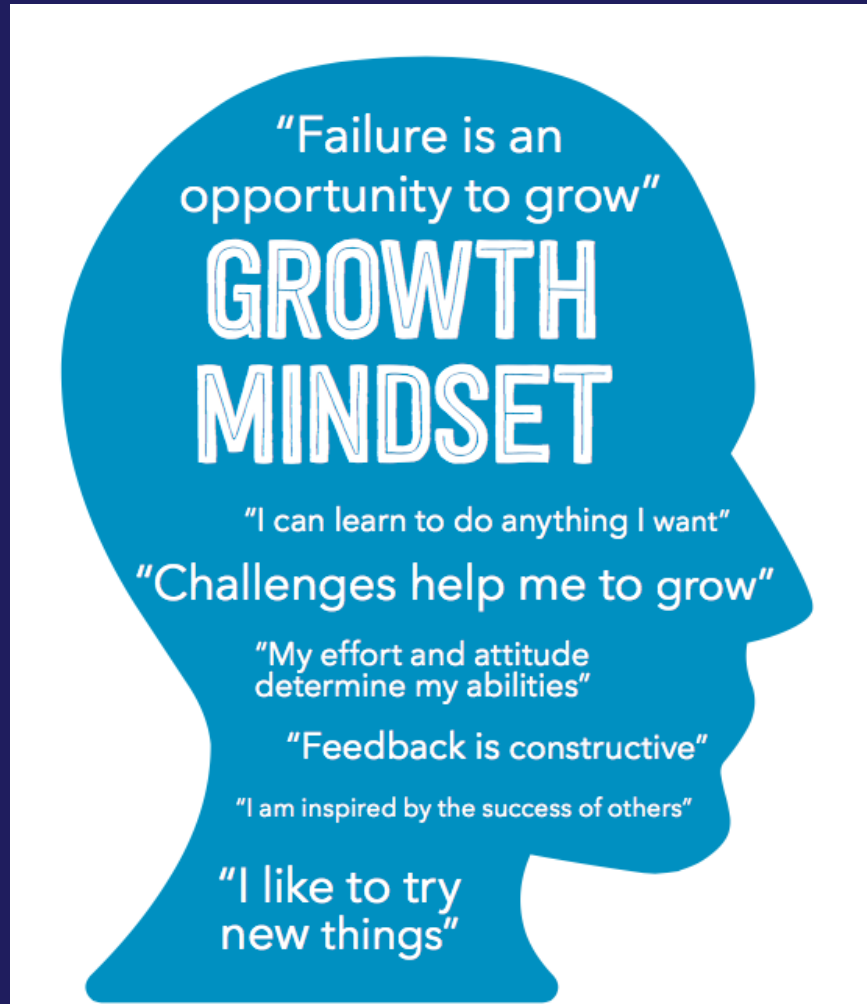
# The student's role.

- Mixing difficult tasks with easier ones will help you to keep your timetable. Place difficult tasks in the “best” slots. These may be the morning if you prefer to work then or the evening if that suits you more.
- Have deadlines and stick to them.
- When you start a piece of work, try and finish it at the time. Otherwise you will waste time when you restart, trying to work out where you were and what you were going to do next.
- Don't put off tasks that you do not want to do.
- Do not put off dealing with things that are unimportant.

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# Family support.

- Talk to your children... about school, friends, anything. If they need to talk, try to make time to listen. Make the most of time in the car!
- Provide a suitable environment to work - a desk with good lighting and space to spread out and put up revision resources.
- Respond positively to requests for help - or to be left alone.



# Family support.

- Stay calm yourself... don't expect too much.
- Keep them well supplied with food and drink.
- Encourage them to take regular breaks.
- Encourage morning revision.
- Limit screens late at night. Earlier bedtimes!
- Encourage use of a revision timetable.
- Accept one week, day, hour or minute may be different to the last!

Plenty of practice – walking, talking mocks and PPEs – make the sports hall your comfort zone!

*(Walking, talking mock – these are exams where the teacher reads the questions and provides help/guidance as to how to answer the paper to train students in how to produce high quality answers.)*



# After school revision sessions/ session 6s.

- Year 11 timeline published for students and parents. Available at the start of next half term.
- PPE Exam timetable – will be sent out via students
- Session 6 – will run until the November PPE week. They will then stop until Christmas and students will come home at the end of session 5.
- However, mandatory session 6 will restart again in January for the run up to the February PPE series.



# Intervention support.

- English, Maths and Science activities in form time – consolidation and recall.
- Intervention support : some small maths group intervention.
- English and Maths specialist TAs work in year 11 groups.
- Catch up withdrawal at tutor times - with specialist TAs - covers work missed due to absence.
- Immersion Days - some subjects have timetabled 'immersion days' that allow longer periods of time to be dedicated to tackling a particular section of a syllabus.



# How to Revise

- Students have a revision methods leaflet to support with ideas. ( attached to today's email)
- Revision strategies covered in tutor time.

## **Covered throughout previous years:**

- Look, cover, write, check.... over and over and over again!
- Complete exam questions - with mark schemes! Don't just have go and keep making the same mistakes!
- Verbal testing - grab anyone to test you - articulating answers helps to cement facts in your mind.
