


# GCSE Art and Design

If you have enjoyed what you have done in your Art lessons in years 7 and 8, you should consider taking Art and Design. It isn't just about if you are good at it.

Between 2011 and 2019, jobs in the creative industries grew 23.1% more than all other jobs in the UK.

UK creative industries generate more than £100bn a year to the UK economy and employ more than 2m people.





## Course details and what you will study:

In Year 9, you will develop and extend your experience of using media looking at collage, mixed media work, printing, paint, pastel and pencil, as well as other forms of art.

For the GCSE Art and Design Years 10 and 11, you will be required to cover a range of different themes creating a range of ideas, analysing artists work, developing best ideas in different media to make final pieces of work.

For the GCSE Art and Design course you will be assessed on the following:

A range of art work completed in lessons that covers the assessment objectives for this subject. It forms 60% of your GCSE.

An externally set assignment that forms the other 40%. This is a body of work done in response to a theme set in the Spring term of Year 11, with a final piece of work completed over 2 designated days.



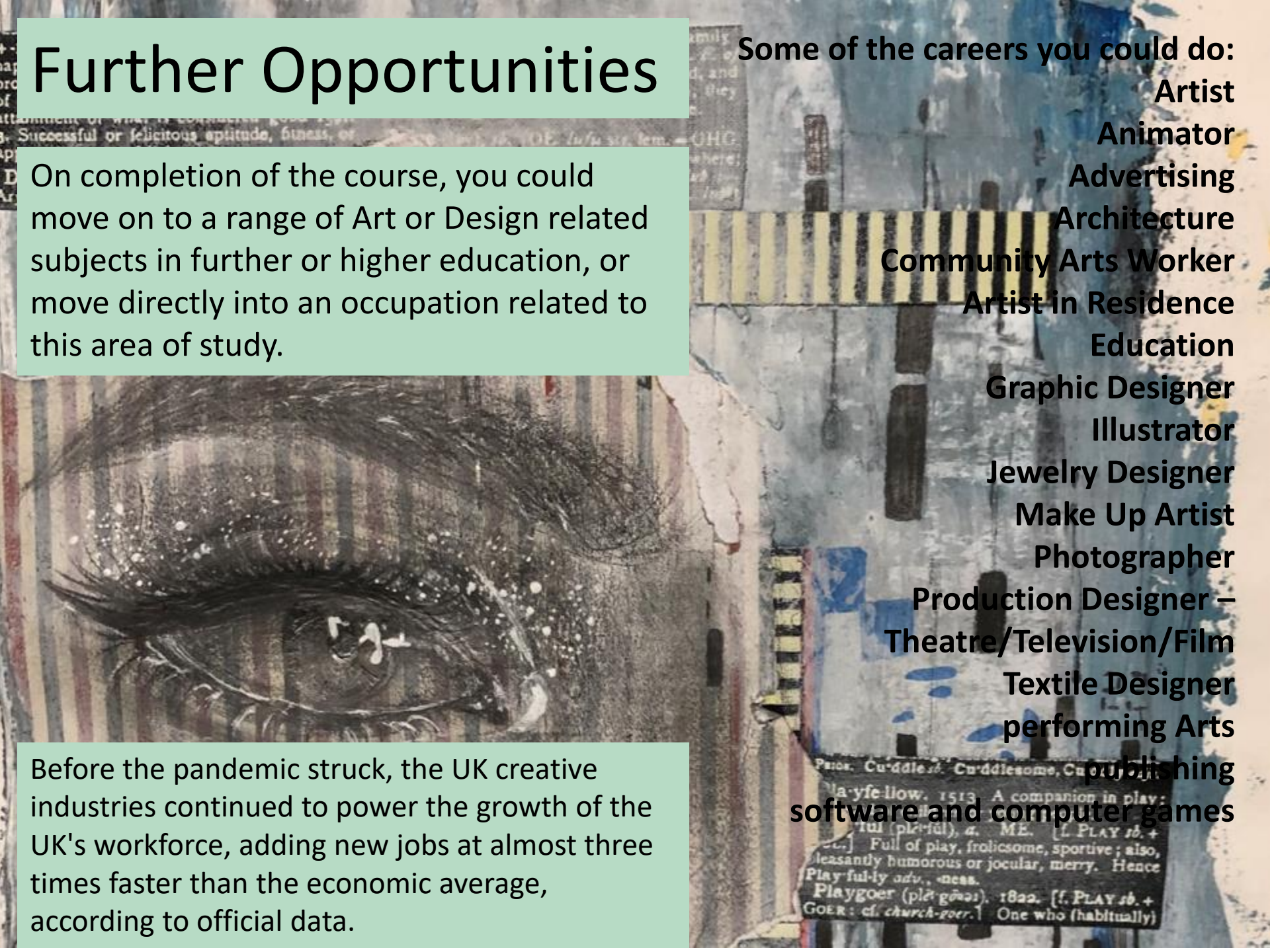
# Further Opportunities
