STRATEGY STATEMENT

During the Summer of 2021, the government offered funding to schools to enable them to deliver a 'summer school' during the summer break. This initiative was aimed at improving the transition experience for Year 6 students who had not been able to participate in a full transition programme during the previous term due to rising COVID cases in the UK.

Bishop Perowne took the decision to run a Summer school between August 9th and August 13th 2021, as we felt it would provide our new Year 7 students with the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the school site, begin to form friendships with their new peer group and build relationships with key staff.

The Summer school was open to all Year 6 students due to join us in September 2021 and students were able to book in for the whole week or part weeks as their previous commitments allowed.
